## 1 Ross Administration Building

The Ross Administration Building offers a one-stop shop for students, with the offices of Admissions and Student Aid; Finance and Business; Registrar; and the Division of Undergraduate Studies all located on the first floor. Apply for admission, get help with financial aid, pay your bill, register for classes, and meet with a counselor about your schedule all within the same suite.

Students who need tutors, quiet study spaces, or disability accommodations will find help in the Center for Academic Achievement, located in room 105. Those who are feeling under the weather can visit the nurse in the Health Services suite, located in 106 of the RAB.

On the second floor are the offices of Academic Affairs, Development, Human Resources, and the Chancellor. Faculty offices can be found on the second floor and the lower level of the building.

## 2 Lion Shrine and Lion Bench

Situated near the visitors parking area, the Nittany Lion Shrine stands as a monument to Penn State's traditions. Nearby, the Nittany Lion mascot relaxes on a bench, ready to take a photo with you and your family.

## 3 Laboratory Classroom Building

The Laboratory Classroom Building (LCB) is home to biology and computer labs, professors' offices, and the largest auditorium classroom on campus. Peek over the hill behind the LCB to see the campus garden, where we grow produce to use in our dining hall and to donate to local charities.

## 4 General Classroom Building

The General Classroom Building (GCB) houses several types of classrooms, including auditorium and seminar style. The GCB also has newly furnished study lounges and faculty offices throughout.

## 5 Library

The Penn State Beaver Library isn't just for books (though more than 40,000 are housed here). It's also a place to access online journal articles, borrow DVDs and CDs, rent laptops, reserve cameras and microphones, and charge smart phones and tablets.

The library staff is always available to help locate and reserve resources and to answer research questions. The lower level of the library is home to a psychology lab, a study room, and a traditional-style classroom.

## 6 Baker Engineering and Sciences Building

Named in honor of the engineering firm founder and Penn State alumnus who helped to start the Beaver campus, the newly renovated Michael Baker Science and Engineering Building is home to art, chemistry, communications, engineering, and information sciences and technology classes.

In addition to general classrooms, the building boasts organic and general chemistry labs, a physics lab, an Information Science and Technology computer lab, a Mac lab, and a photography and video studio. IST students are welcome to use the Idea Lab for group projects, and engineering students have access to a Maker Space with a variety of equipment, including a CNC router and 3D printers.

## 7 Harmony Hall

Our newly renovated residence building, Harmony Hall, is home to up to 216 resident students. Residents can enter the secure building with a swipe of their ID cards and have access to their rooms, study spaces, a game room, a laundry room, and the lobby, where many events take place.

Harmony Hall also has a kitchen for residents who may want to cook an occasional meal. Both residence life coordinators and resident assistants live in the building to support our students.

Behind Harmony Hall is a sports court, sand volleyball court, pavilion, bonfire pit, and a 96-foot-long high tunnel greenhouse.

## 8 Brodhead Bistro

The Brodhead Bistro is a full-service food court with many culinary options for students, faculty, and staff, including a salad bar, a grill, a pizza station, a soup station, and daily specials. The Bistro also offers an assortment of grab-and-go foods and convenience items. Students who need a pick-me-up can stop at Starbucks for a coffee or espresso drink.

The Bistro is open seven days a week during the fall and spring semesters, and meal plans are available.

## 9 Student Union Building

The Student Union Building is home to the auditorium, as well as the offices of Campus Relations, Student Affairs, and Continuing Education.

The auditorium can be found on the lower level, along with meeting rooms, the game room, the bookstore, and the campus radio station. The Lodge, an event space that hosts banquets and large-group meetings, is located on the upper level. The Student Activities Suite holds a computer lab, club meeting space, a lounge area, and the Career and Personal Counseling office.

Students and visitors looking to relax can use the lounge areas on both floors.

## 10 Wellness Center

Named in honor of former Penn State Beaver Chancellor Gary B. Keefer, the Wellness Center is home to a state-of-the-art weight room with cardio machines, aerobics and weightlifting equipment, and a wellness room for yoga and group fitness classes.

## 11 Gymnasium

The gymnasium is home to a 1,000-spectator field house with collegiate regulation basketball and volleyball courts, a team and training room, indoor batting cage, and multipurpose classroom.
